Yesterday, two plain clothed and unidentified Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) officers – one wearing a mask – reportedly attempted to arrest a person inside one of the terminals at Harry Reid International Airport in Las Vegas. They appeared to be assisted by a TSA agent in tackling an elderly man, who the Las Vegas Metro Police Department later found had no outstanding warrants. This unacceptable action is another stark reminder that ICE continues to act with impunity, instilling fear in our communities, and in this case, the traveling public.
 - a. Mr. Cummins, we know that TSA has entered into an information sharing agreement with ICE. Does this agreement require proof from ICE that the individuals they are requesting information about have active warrants against them? If you are confirmed, and if the agreement does not require evidence from ICE, will you commit to requiring ICE to provide evidence of an active warrant before information is shared or before TSA assists in ICE enforcement actions in airports?
 - b. Does TSA have any policy regarding how law enforcement agencies are to identify themselves when they are in airports or when attempting to take enforcement actions in airports? If not, how would you address this if confirmed?
 - c. Does ICE agents failing to identify themselves or masking their identities with face coverings jeopardize passengers' safety and security? Would you allow this if confirmed?
 - d. I know that you were a long time Senior Vice President at Serco, who are contracted with the Government to provide training to ICE officers. To your knowledge, has Serco in the past or currently trained ICE agents on how to conceal or mask their identities?
